





Described by several anthropologists, there are approximately 3814 distinct cultures, each with their own beliefs, tradition, language, history and art forms. The species as a whole exploits the tendency to diverge through cognitive systems which marks differences between communities, forming different cultures.

Cultural identity is used as a reference to the way a group of people lead their lives. Culture also greatly influences communication. Communication varies in different cultures creating a barrier between groups of people. As such, what is deemed acceptable by one culture or community may not be accepted by another. There are a myriad of beliefs and customs which differ between different cultures. The mere concept of love marriage is not acceptable among many Muslims whereas it is encouraged in the American continents. According to the Islamic religion, the concept of 'love before marriage' is not inherently haram, but rather the expression of romantic or intimate love outside the framework of marriage is considered haram. Even with marriages, many cultures have unique ways of celebrating weddings.

 The basic forms of greeting also differ between cultures. 'Namaste' is commonly used to express deep respect and greetings. It is a formal salutation used not only in India but also in Nepal, by Hindus, Jains and Buddhists, and many continue to use this outside the Indian subcontinent. Bows are the traditional greeting in East Asia, particularly in Japan, Korea, Hong Kong, China and Vietnam. On the contrary, in

continents other than Asia a simple firm handshake is used to show greetings.

The frequency of cultural and population differentiation also relates to the probability of a boundary, natural or social, forming between two communities. High levels of diversity of cultures are more likely to occur where there is a high probability of geographical isolation, and where there is a high gradient in resource availability between habitats. Culture is what shapes us and our identities. Culture is a treasure trove of richness and diversity and a reflection of our shared human heritage that is both fascinating and beautiful.



thrives, A celebration of life, where the heart of sport survives.



## S5: E2 Quantum Computing - Schanna Muliyil IBDP 2


